

Heritage School Dress Code

2011-2012

We ask your cooperation in creating a uniform look to our student dress. All students in Kindergarten – 12th grade are required to wear khaki pants, shorts, or skirts.

EC and Pre-K

- may wear clean, neat, comfortable clothes
- must wear tennis shoes at school
- must purchase a Heritage logo shirt to wear on field trips and special occasions

Kindergarten through Grade 4

- khaki pants, shorts, skirts, and jumpers with no embellishments
- navy blue, collared, polo-style shirts (white is permissible during 1st and 4th quarters); shirts may be plain or feature the Heritage logo; no other logos are permissible
- **all shirts must be of sufficient length that they may be tucked in**
- white turtleneck/mock turtlenecks, or collared, white blouses are permissible when worn under a plain navy sweater, a navy Heritage sweatshirt, or plain navy sweatshirt
- the only outerwear to be worn in the classrooms is either a plain navy sweatshirt or a Heritage navy sweatshirt
- a Heritage logo shirt must be purchased to wear on field trips and special occasions
- Heritage sports t-shirts and other “fan” shirts may be worn ONLY on days when special permission to wear them is given
- white crew socks; white or navy knee-length socks; and/or white or navy tights
- NO patterned socks or tights will be permitted
- tennis shoes ONLY

Middle School [Grades 5 through 8]

- khaki pants, walking shorts, skirts, and jumpers
- navy blue collared, polo or buttoned down style shirts (white is permissible during 1st and 4th quarters); shirts may be plain or feature the Heritage logo; no other logos are permissible
- all shirts must be of sufficient length that they may be tucked in
- white turtleneck/mock turtlenecks or collared blouses are permissible when worn under a plain navy sweater, a navy Heritage sweatshirt, or plain navy sweatshirt
- the only sweatshirts that are allowed are plain navy or any style/color Heritage logo sweatshirt
- Heritage sports t-shirts and other “fan” shirts may be worn ONLY on days when special permission to wear them is given
- white crew socks, white or navy knee-length socks, or tights [NO patterned socks or tights will be permitted]
- tennis shoes, dress shoes, or leather sandals (no rubber shoes)
- rain boots may be worn during inclement weather

Upper School [Grades 9-12]

- boys and girls may wear collared dress, polo, or turtleneck shirts
- all shirts must be of sufficient length that they may be tucked in
- sweaters may be worn over a tucked-in, collared shirt or a turtleneck/mock turtleneck
- girls may wear sleeveless tops or collarless blouses that do not reveal undergarments
- shirts designed to be tucked in must be tucked in
- students may NOT wear regular t-shirts or long-sleeved t-shirts to school
- the only sweatshirts that may be worn are Heritage sweatshirts of any style or color
- boys and girls must wear khaki pants of a proper fit
- Heritage sports t-shirts and other “fan” shirts may be worn ONLY on days when special permission to wear them is given
- students may also wear khaki walking shorts (not denim) at least mid-thigh in length, 7 inch inseam
- all pants designed to be worn with a belt must be worn with a belt
- girls may also wear khaki skirts at least mid-thigh in length
- students should wear dress shoes or neatly laced tennis shoes to school
- sandals, excluding flip flops or any other rubber sandal, may be worn in warm weather
- Upper School students will be permitted to observe Casual Friday along with the faculty and staff; on Fridays, students may wear jeans of proper fit; jeans should not be cut or frayed; please note that shirt requirements do not change on Fridays
- male US students must have dress shoes, dress slacks, dress shirts, and tie; they may be required to wear these on certain occasions and field trips
- female US students will also be required to dress in a more formal manner on some occasions; dresses, dress slacks, dress skirts and blouses, and dress shoes are considered appropriate attire on such occasions
- there should be no visible caps on campus from 8:30 a.m. to 3:15 p.m., other than during inclement weather, when they may only be worn from class to class

Please note that the administration expects students to observe common rules of courtesy, even if they are not enumerated in this code, for example, removing caps indoors. The faculty and staff have the final say in matters of appropriate dress.
